Looking around at the chaos we see in the news, the political division, hatred, violence, COVID, and unrest, it's hard not to be overcome by the darkness and feel hopeless if you dwell on it too long. Ministry this summer has been extraordinarily active. While many detention facilities have been closed to outside groups and ministries, the West Central Regional Juvenile Detention Center has been wide open to us since mid-June. Bible studies, church services, one on ones. It has been amazing to see

how God has flung the doors open, and the ministry continues to grow. One of the most exciting things has been the number of kids who have made contact with us as they leave or have left the facility. Aftercare is something that we have prayed for and is so necessary for these kids' success as they get out, but we have been hindered by the fact that they have to make contact with us. We are and making an eternal difference in currently not allowed to have their contact information as they leave, so kids making contact is a huge answer to prayer.

As we enter into the fall, our ministry at the Red River Alternative Learning Center and Woodrow Wilson High School has changed. With COVID restrictions, outside groups are very limited in what they can do, but we continue to look for new and creative ways to connect and let students and staff know we haven't forgotten about them and that God loves them.

One young lady who has been in the juvenile center for a year has had some ups and downs. She has done an amazing job keeping it together through it all. It is hard to imagine not seeing the sun or breathing fresh air for over 7 months. She has been growing in her faith and I have talked to the secure supervisor about the possibility of taking her to church on Sundays. The supervisor loved the idea and said that we would have to get the permission of the judge. I then talked to this young lady about the idea and she was beyond excited. We told her she would have to write a letter to the judge and explain to them who we are, what we do, and the idea of Patty and I taking her out to church on Sundays and spending time with her. Patty and I have done it before with many kids, so we have a positive track record with the facility and this type of outing. All of the center staff were excited about this opportunity too. Just over three weeks ago, we got a very excited call from her that the Judge granted us permission to take her to church. We have taken her to church these last three Sundays and words cannot explain how excited she is to be out, at church, and with us. This was truly an answer to prayer. She is continuing to grow in her love for Christ by leaps and bounds. She is one of the young people I meet with weekly one-on-one. We are currently studying through the book of John.
