Parent Life Interview with Linda

What excites you looking back on the last 25 years of ministry?

One of the exciting parts about being in the ministry so long is seeing the original girls I worked with have kids who have now all graduated from high school. There are al these statistics about teen parents that say their children will do poorly academically, be more likely to end up in prison, etc. It is just one of the coolest things to see how they went on to defy the odds as their children graduated from high school and many of them went on to college.

What were some frequently asked questions by adults in the community?

"Don't they know how to parent? Don't they know any better?" If they never had involved and nurturing parents, they don't know what they were missing. If they were neglected as children they often provide the minimum for their children. It's not that they don't want to be good parents, but they model what they know. Another example is the drugs and alcohol. If their parents used their whole life and that is what they know, that's how they learn to cope.

When you envision what the future of Parent Life ministry looks like, what do you see?

More classes and programming as well as growth into the West Fargo community. More meetings outside the school system. Partnership with parent life programs like that of Woodrow Wilson HS.

Parent Life Through the Years

One 14 year old girl found out she was pregnant and was absolutely set on adoption. She told me, "I can't even get a job at McDonalds at my age, how am I going to raise a child?" Her boyfriend was 13 and his family wanted him to have custody of the baby. They put pressure on the mom for custody. She knew he partied and drank and did not want her baby to grow up in that environment. She felt like she had no choice and was the more fit to be a parent, so she kept the child. She had this beautiful baby girl while being a child herself. She didn't like being touched and wasn't a nurturer and it's almost as if she resented it all. She wouldn't even look the baby girl in the eyes while she

was feeding her. The stress of parenting became too much for her and she ended up attempting suicide. She always dated these losers and would say things like, "if he isn't a jerk, he doesn't really love me." Later when her daughter was about 15



she met a nice quy different from her previous "type." They got married and I attended her wedding. When I saw her she gave me a hug which was weird since she wasn't previously much of a touchy person. She said, "My



husband is a hugger, his mom's a hugger, and now we're all huggers." They later had three more children as well as her adult daughter. She has grown up to be a godly woman who prays for people, hosts women's gatherings, and is well known in her community. I met Elise when she was 15 and pregnant with a little girl Her boyfriend was part of a gang. I ended up finding out that one of the other girls in our group had a boyfriend from a rival gang. We had to



be careful that neither men knew the girlfriends were both part of this group. (This was back when gang population was really on the rise in Fargo.) Elise lived with her mom and sister who were mentally ill. A year after having her little girl she found out she was pregnant again. She wanted to finish school, but at that time, had to be working to get daycare



assistance. So, she worked, went to school, raised her two kids, and managed to graduate with her class. Jessica and I attended her graduation ceremony. We were walking in when she ran up carrying her two kids and asked Jessica and I to watch

them. She didn't have anyone else to watch them during the ceremony. She was always very quiet at group and I never really knew why she came because she wouldn't interact much. She later asked me, "You knew why I came didn't you?" She replied that it was because of me. She told me I was the one who cared about her and she came every

week because I cared. This was so humbling because all this time I had no idea this is why she was coming. She went on to school to become and RN and later to school again to be a PA. She is now married with two girls and a boy. ~Linda Bass

Her case worker has primary care of her. She struggles with her



temper, which gets her in trouble on a constant basis. I have had many opportunities to sit and have one-onone conversations with her. She has hopes and dreams and I pray that God brings someone in her life to guide



her and walk through life with her. When she was in shelter care, we were able to take her to church and lunch on Sundays. God has given us the awesome opportunity to love on her and point her to Jesus. I ask that you pray for this young lady. Pray that she surrenders her life to Jesus, we have more opportunities to love on her, and that God would bring more people into her life to love on her.
