He was longing for a relationship and craving one with our Lord and Savior. It was such a blessing to do that with him for a few weeks. He has since been able to leave, so please pray that he reaches out to continue this relationship with God while he's out (He's local to where we're at)! Lastly, while at church a couple of weeks ago in the boys' secure pod, I asked if anybody wanted to close in prayer. After a little silence, a staff member spoke up and said he would love to pray for the kids. This particular staff and I have connected fairly well over the last year with a few common connections. However, it was so cool to see God use a staff member to care for more than just these kids' physical needs, but also their spiritual needs!

Students could fill a sheet out at lunch and give them to the teacher they filled one out for. Two of the girls in the class handed me fan mail. Even though a lot of it was jokingly done, I still knew deep down there is a connection that has been made for them to "waste" their time and fill one of the letters out. I have
