
the community your support for teens and a great way to get your name in front of people.

Pregnancy

Many of the kids are so fascinated with my pregnancy and ask all kinds of guestions. While at first, I chuckled, now I've grown to see it as such a conversation starter and an opportunity to have all kinds of difficult conversations with kids. Many youth don't have a safe person to discuss whatever they want, no matter how uncomfortable the topic. I've definitely learned to be an open book and feel so honored that kids trust me enough as a safe place to ask anything. On a lighter note, here are some of my favorite questions I've been asked:

- Can I call you after you have your baby to hold it? I've never held one.
- What happens if the baby starts coming out feet first? Do they push it back in and flip it around?
- Can I touch your belly when the baby starts moving? When will that be?

It's also sparked conversations with the teen moms I've started connecting with. A lot of parents are given unsolicited advice, but not many are asked, "What's worked for you?" While sometimes it's humbling to listen to a much younger mom's advice, it's so life-giving for them. ~Danielle Beyer


Samson

Samson has been one of my favorite stories to read and discuss with the boys at the detention center. The engagement is awesome despite the amount of reading (many struggle in reading). It gives us the opportunity to discuss how God uses broken people, show how our strength comes from God, and many more life lessons. In the last group we took through this story, only 1 of 9 kids had even heard of who Samson was. The reactions to when he got his eyes gouged out were as if they were watching an action movie. Many were stunned that a story like this was in the Bible. With one group, we got a little off-topic at the part when Samson was captured. When asked if they wanted to close or finish the story. They all exclaimed they wanted to finish and "See how this plays out." When asked why they thought God gave Samson his strength back, one kid responded, "I bet He (God) was like I'll give you your strength back one last time to do this for me and then you gotta go cause you broke our deal." Will asked how a good God would let so many people die. One kid quickly responded that they were worshiping other gods. It's often amazing how much they actually are paying attention. 




This year at Moorhead ALC, we focused on stories. Almost | all of the staff and volunteers shared pieces of their stories,

- Is it all worth it in the end?




Project Serve
