Since I last shared, a lot has happened. I am now going into the juvenile center a lot, three or sometimes four times a week doing Bible studies, church, and youth appointments! I love going to the juvenile center, those boys are awesome! A lot of them are right where they need to be to hear the gospel and respond. It is such a joy to see them every week. One day we went in to do a church service and it was focusing on the Passion Week of Jesus.

We showed movie clips from the "Passion of the Christ" movie. There were so many questions asked by this one group that I couldn't even answer them all. We honestly ran out of time! While we were there, one of the boys, John,* said, "Hey, I saw y'all meeting with one of my friends the other day. What was that for?" We told him we meet with whoever wants to meet for counsel, questions, or to get something off your chest. He said, "I wanna meet!" The next day, we sat down with him and talked for a while about what he had been through, who Jesus is, what He did for us, and what that meant for him. John cried out "Jesus is Lord! Jesus save me, forgive me, I believe in You." We had just enough time with him before his mom came for a visit. It was such an incredible moment, and we are grateful to have been a part of seeing this young man come to Christ!

I also love going to the Alternative Learning Center! I have started going there every about two and a half hours every Monday and Tuesday. I am a mentor to several students who struggle in school. I meet with them and coach them on being productive and improving as students in homework, attendance, tasks, etc. Some of these kids are the same ones who come to the Church for activities on Thursdays. I can't talk about the Bible or Jesus at school unless the students ask or bring it up, so please pray for opportunities to share the Gospel with them. I can lead a Bible study outside of school if they want.

I got the chance to share my testimony with some of the students in our activities one Thursday. When I asked if anyone had any questions for me after we were done, nobody said anything, and I was a bit discouraged. When I stepped down from the stage and started walking around the gym, nine or ten students came up to me and started asking me so many questions about addiction, suffering, living in Memphis, hardships they faced, etc. They weren't comfortable asking in the larger setting, but something I said had pricked their hearts and they wanted to hear more. Praise God that He can use my past to reach these kids!

We got a chance to talk for a little bit before the bus left. Her story broke my heart. She said she wanted to talk more and invited me to sit with her and her friends at lunch whenever I came around. Pray I am able to connect more with these youth and that the love of Christ beams from me as I love them and get to know more of their stories.
